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Through Operation Round Up, NEC members can round up their electric bills to the nearest dollar, never exceeding 99¢ per month. The spare change then goes to supporting Nueces Electric Charities, Inc.. 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UNDERSTANDING THE RESTORATION PROCESS

When severe weather causes outages, power restoration follows a planned process designed to safely restore service to the greatest number of members as quickly as possible.



Transmission lines carry electricity from power plants to transmission substations. Although these lines rarely fail, damage can impact thousands of members. Because restoring transmission service can return power to large areas, these repairs receive immediate attention.



Once transmission service is restored, crews inspect and repair local distribution substations. Each substation serves thousands of members, so restoring these facilities can bring power back to large portions of the system.



Next, crews restore the primary distribution lines that carry electricity from substations to communities and neighborhoods. Repairing these main lines restores power to the greatest number of members before work begins on smaller outages.



After the main distribution lines are repaired, crews move to tap lines, which deliver electricity from the main lines to smaller groups of homes and businesses. Restoring these lines brings power back to individual neighborhoods.



The final step is repairing service lines that connect electricity from the utility pole to individual homes or businesses. If your neighbors have power but you do not, the issue may be isolated to your service line. If the damage is on the member-owned side of the electric meter, a licensed electrician may be needed before service can be restored.

Remember: Power restoration doesn't always happen street by street. Crews follow this sequence to safely restore power to the greatest number of members as quickly as possible. During major outages, additional line crews, contractors, and neighboring electric cooperatives may also assist with restoration efforts.
